### ANNUAL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The Annual Meeting of the FHRPC was called to order by President, Cliff Bennett, members present 58. Cliff asked for a moment of silence for our departed brothers this past year they were, Brian Buck, Brook C. Atkinson, Luther Reynolds and Jay N. Cole, Jr., followed with the Invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.

The meeting was held at CTE in their auditorium on McMullen Highway in Cresaptown, MD. The topics of interest were (1) the ratification of two By-Law changes, the first concerning life membership and second the rescheduling of club dues collection. (2) Range improvements for 2016. (3) 2016 Raffle at the Rendezvous.

### RATIFICATION OF BY-LAW CHANGE – NO LIFE MEMBERSHIPS

John Dowell spoke on the need to change or we were heading down a road similar to Social Security where we have a few paying for many. As of this newsletter, we have 117 Life members. This is 26% of the membership and this number continues to grow.

Liability Insurance cost on total membership and membership numbers keep going up and we are charged per member. With attrition, life expectancy of members in 1944 was 63 where as today members can reach into their 80's.

In 2001 we had 46 life members in fifteen years that number has grown more than 2.5 times itself. In the past that number was thought by some to reduce through attrition, which never happened.

Members were asked to entertain a motion that we have a By-law change and ratification. Members had discussion and Sylvester Shultz made a motion for accepting option (3) bold faced below. Cliff Bennett seconded that motion. Vote taken 41 yeas, no nays and some abstained.

With 41 yes votes and 58 in attendance there was no need to entertain the other two options. All current members will be treated in accordance to current Article 3.2 Life Membership.

### OPTIONS AVAILABLE

(1) A Life Member is any member in good standing with twenty-five or more years of continuous membership in FHRPC and is at least sixty-five years of age. A Life Member is exempt from paying yearly dues.

(2) A Life Member is any member in good standing with twenty-five or more years of continuous membership in FHRPC and is at least sixty-five years of age. A Life Member is entitled to a 50% reduction in annual dues.

**(3) Drop the category of Life Membership completely.**

Article 3.2 Life Membership: A Life Member is any member in good standing with twenty-five or more years of continuous membership with the FHRPC. A Life Member is exempt from paying yearly dues.

**Article 3.2B Life Membership Dropped After 2015.** The category of life membership is dropped completely for all members who joined FHRPC after 2015. All members who joined prior to 2016 will be treated in accordance to Article 3.2 Life Membership.

**The change will not affect membership status of any current member, only those joining the club after 2015. All current members will be treated in accordance to current Article 3.2 Life Membership.**

## PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGE TO ARTICLE 5 DUES

The Membership Secretaries have been discussing a possible dues schedule change to Article 5.1 Annual Dues By-Law to facilitate the paying of dues. V.P. Chris Bennett gave a detailed report on the confusion and frustration associated with the current Article 5.1 and asked the membership body to entertain the proposed amendment to Article 5.1.

After discussion, Denny Steward motioned we accept the proposal that was followed by a second from Cliff Bennett. Vote was taken, unanimous was the outcome.

## BY-LAW ARTICLE 5.1 NOW READS

Annual dues must be paid by December 31st of each year with a grace period to and including January 31st. Dues accepted after December 31st may be assessed a late fee. After January 31st a regular member who failed to pay his dues is no longer in good standing and will be dropped from the membership roster.

## RANGE IMPROVEMENTS 2016

Included in the proposed 2016 Budget report were improvements to a) Target frame storage/black powder area to be concreted. b) Black top road from gate to the top of the hill at pistol burn barrel. And if and when funds become available, c) Possible covered firing line at undesignated range. d) Install mover at undesignated range.

**Deer Rifle BR** held at the 100 yard rifle range with cash prizes, the rules/regulations as of this newsletter are;

Muzzle Diameter - .70 and under, sporter barrels, no Hbar.

Any Scope, but must be set on 9X or less.

Minimum caliber is .24, no Wildcats.

Any two piece rifle rest you want to use.

Targets start with a 1" dot and get progressively smaller.

**Lever Action** held at the undesignated range with cash prizes will be a plate match similar to last year with improvements to be made to the plate carriers.

Any caliber, any sights.

## GRAINS OF INFO

### **FHRPC Members not fulfilling obligation concerning NRA application.**

Members must submit a filled out NRA application when paying they're NRA dues through FHRPC during the club's dues collection cycle. Any check received with a combination of club and NRA dues and not accompanied with an NRA application fully completed will not be processed; that NRA dues payment will not be forwarded to the NRA. That portion of the check will be considered a donation to FHRPC. It will further be noted that the member didn't fulfill they're obligation.

The NRA recruiter will not fill out the NRA application for you, completing the NRA dues application is not his responsibility, but yours.

NRA applications are available online at [www.fhrpc.org](http://www.fhrpc.org) for those that have computers, by mail for those members receiving dues notices through USPS, and at the clubhouse's inside bulletin board closet to the refrigerator in a manila folder.

**SR-50 matches** will resume this upcoming season starting Monday, April 18th and continuing every Monday but not including Memorial Day and Labor Day. Below is a recap of what, when and where;

What is SR-50? Standing off hand using Small Bore rifle in .22 L.R. at 50 yards shooting at letter size paper target with the X ring, 10 ring and 9 ring which totals three inches in size, making up the black circle. With 8, 7, 6 and 5 rings making up the rest of the scoring target.

When: Match will start when you get there between 5 and 7 p.m. (no shooters after 7p.m. as we want to be home at eight) on Monday evenings at Morningside Range. Total time takes one hour or less.

I will supply targets, three targets per match cost \$2.00 per match... One sighter target up to 10 shots in a 10 minute period, first target 20 shots for score in a 25 minute period, second target 20 shots for score in a 25 minute period. Scoring of targets will be done by yours truly when completed.

You will supply the 50 rounds of .22 L.R. ammo needed to complete the course of fire.

You are not competing against any one, only yourself.

Terrific practice for any shooter that participates in small bore silhouette or any off hand course of fire.

**Muzzleloaders** will meet every Monday starting April 4th thru October 31st starting at 4:00 p.m. We shoot informal matches or just casual shooting. We have lots of fun and make a lot of smoke. Over the season members travel to nearby matches in Maryland, Pennsylvania and West Virginia, including the Pennsylvania and West Virginia State Championships and National Muzzleloading Rifle Association Territorial Matches where you can compete on the national level.

You can shoot any muzzleloading black powder rifle, pistol and black powder cartridge rifle and pistol. Come out and join in the fun, always looking for new faces. For more information you can call Roger Rowe at 301-707-1840 or Mike Winter at 301-729-3540.

Club member Butch Shreve finishes in 8th place, light gun 17 lbs. and less, in the “World Open.” Competing in July 2015, at Williamsport, PA “The original 1000 yd long range club” where 1000 yd shooting started back in the 60’s. Butch shot a 6.5-308, and a 300WSM bench rest rifles to shoot a two day aggregate score of 93.5, and a two day aggregate group size of 2.874 for ten shots. Competing against the best in the world, the world open usually draws several hundred shooters from many states and even foreign countries. The current ten shot World Record for International Bench rest Shooters was shot there a couple years ago. 2.87 inch group for ten shots, and a score of 100!!! Congratulations to Butch Shreve, and it’s another example of some great shooters that call the Fort Hill Rifle and Pistol club their home range.

## JUNIOR SMALLBORE RIFLE LEAGUE IN 2016

The FHRPC, in conjunction with the NRA, has again conducted the Basic Rifle Shooting Course/Rifle Shooting Merit Badge program as part of our junior smallbore rifle league. A schedule follows showing the course of instruction for this program. Any participant that attends five of seven lessons and demonstrates knowledge and proficiency will be recommended for a rifle shooting merit badge and will be given a certificate of completion for the course.

## Hosted by the FORT HILL RIFLE AND PISTOL CLUB

17-18 September 2016 • CMP Sanctioned

1. RANGE LOCATION: The Warrior Mountain Range of the Fort Hill Rifle and Pistol Club, located at 13300 Cresap Mill Road, Oldtown, Maryland 21555. From Interstate 68 east or west take Cumberland exit 43B Industrial Blvd / MD 51 south. Proceed 11.5 miles on MD 51 south and turn left onto Cresap Mill Road. Proceed 3.5 miles to Fort Hill Rifle & Pistol Club gate on right, just past the large power lines. The range gate will open at 6:45 AM each day.

2. RULES: This championship will be governed by the 20th Edition CMP Competition Rules (2016) <http://thecmp.org/competitions/cmp-competitions-rulebooks/>

3. ELIGIBILITY: Open to any individual.

4. AUTHORIZED FIREARMS: Rifles that comply with Rule 6.1.1, M16/AR15KType Rifles, Rule 6.1.2, M14 Type Rifles, or Rule 6.1.3, M1 Garand Type Rifles. Rifles will be inspected at registration.

5. ADVANCE ENTRIES ARE REQUIRED. Range capacity for this championship is 48 competitors per day. Walk on entries may be accepted to fill vacancies on existing relays only.

6. INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES: Make entry through the on-line registration at <http://www.fhrpc.org/servicerifle/>

7. ENTRIES CLOSE: Individual entries close Wednesday, 14 September 2016, or whenever range capacity is met. Entries received after September 14, 2016 or after range capacity is initially met may be accepted to fill vacancies on existing relays only.

8. FEES: 40 for Championship & EIC (20 for Saturday's Championship; 20 for Sunday's EIC). CHALLENGE FEE: 3.00.

9. SQUADDING: All matches will be squadded. Squadding tickets for individual matches will be issued during registration.

10. TARGET SERVICE: Target pullers will not be provided. Competitors will pull their own targets.

11. SCORING: Competitors will score. Any competitor failing to perform their scoring duties may be disqualified.

12. EMPTY CHAMBER INDICATOR (ECI): An NRA-approved empty chamber indicator is required to be in your rifle except during the preparation period or firing of your relay.

13. INCLEMENT WEATHER: The Championship will continue to run in mild to moderate rain.

14. AWARDS: FHRPC will present awards to the following competitors:

–Maryland State Service Rifle 2nd Place

–Maryland State Service Rifle 3rd Place
